1. Hearings Office update	Filing of new opposition and revocation cases has decreased.
	63 TM cases waiting to be heard.
	Handful of old patent cases – taking out those on public interest.
	12 – 13 months medium time to schedule hearing – IPONZ have target of four months - from when Office advises that matter in order for a hearing.
	 Four hearings officers: Natasha Alley: Trade Marks, Designs, Geographic Indications;
	 Wendy Aldred: Trade Marks, Patents; Nigel Robb: Trade Marks, Designs, Geographic Indications; Mark Luiten: Patents, Plant Variety Rights.
	Hearings Officer availability is significantly higher than previously = 120 hours per week compared with previous 40-50 hours per week.
	IPONZ believe have enough capacity at this stage and the right number of Hearings Officers.
	IPONZ think number of cases to become in order for hearing in short term will slow down.
	Hearings proceeding by video and in-person – either option available.
	Procedural steps – processing in usual turnaround time.
	Automatic extensions of time for evidence – automatically pushed out by 3 months – until 31 July 2020.

2. Electronic case files at Hearings	IPONZ is keen to move hearings away from being paper based.
	Steffen requested email feedback – what would like to see (or not)
	Greg Arthur – suggested that IPONZ look to court requirements for guidance but bear in mind that that incurs a bit of expense.
	Expect update at next TFG
3. Automatic extensions of time	In recognition of limitations due to COVID-19 IPONZ has been automatically extending deadlines for certain tasks, esp. evidence (apart from initial evidence in non-use proceedings),
	Greg Arthur – wouldn't want anything unnecessarily delay matters getting to a hearing.
	IPONZ created work around so that both parties notified of extension.
	Exceptional reasons would cover COVID-19. Elena asked if party could request extension on exceptional grounds first if faced with COVID limitations and then still have access to extension on reasonable grounds. Steffen said IPONZ would be flexible in the circumstances.
	IPONZ is considering whether to continue with automatic extension after 31 July. Email Steffen asap if any more feedback.
	IPONZ generally schedule the oldest case first but examination hearings / interlocutory matters may go earlier.
	There was significant displeasure from TFG members about ongoing delays in hearing dates. Garry Williams suggested IPONZ could run a short notice list to assist with scheduling. Sheana Wheeldon suggested that IPONZ could speed up setting down – email / phone proposing two dates and have short turn around
