| 1. Review of Previous<br>Meeting Action<br>Points | IPONZ has been liaising with IP Australia in their capacities is<br>PCT Receiving Offices regarding the treatment of drawings.<br>Both IPONZ and IPAU are feeding back to WIPO about<br>improving and updating the drawings tools in view of the strict<br>requirement that drawings be black & white. IPONZ try and<br>take a pragmatic approach and not object if the drawings are<br>understandable and the features are clear. |
|   | IPONZ team leaders, principal examiners and the Quality<br>Assurance team have been discussing ways to improve<br>examination efficiencies.  |
|   | IPONZ is interested in pursuing a bilateral PPH agreement with the EPO, but that has not progressed.   |
|   | There has been no change to IPONZ policy regarding refunds of official fees. Any change would require an IPONZ-wide approach.  |
|   | IPONZ are developing a task-based workflow for GPPH<br>requests, similar in concept to the workflow for handling<br>restoration requests. They hope to include it in the software<br>enhancement after the next release, which is due to be in<br>February 2022.   |
|   | IPONZ are also looking to improve the visibility of applications<br>that have been referred to the Maori Advisory Committee<br>(MAC), most likely via the search function in the database.   |

| 2. IPONZ update | Recruitment   |
|                 | The large intake of new examiners that started in August 2021 have now completed their initial training and have joined examination teams. IPONZ is planning further recruitment in early 2022.   |
|                 | Backlogs and pendency times   |
|                 | The 'Facts and figures' section on IPONZ's website (under<br>'About us') includes information about IPONZ filing volumes.<br>The 2020/2021 'Year in review' document will also include<br>information about backlogs and pendency times.  |
|                 | In response to a question regarding the output of first<br>examination reports from the science teams, IPONZ advised<br>that they have had a higher than usual volume of mail to<br>process. There has also been some diversion of staff from<br>IPONZ to support the MBIE-wide COVID response, but not from<br>the science examination teams. The COVID extensions have led<br>to a lot of cases having similar response deadlines and/or final<br>acceptance deadlines. |
|                 | As at 3 December 2021, there were 380 PA1953 applications<br>under examination. Dealing with a number of older cases has<br>also reduced the output of PA2013 first examination reports<br>from the science teams.  |
| 3. MBIE policy  | IP Laws Amendment Bill  |
| update          | MBIE have received an initial draft and the policy team have<br>provided comments to the MBIE legal section to prepare<br>drafting instructions for the Parliamentary Counsel Office. The<br>MBIE legal section are, however, also dealing with a large<br>volume of COVID response work. MBIE hope to release an<br>exposure draft in early 2022. This bill, however, remains a<br>relatively low priority.  |
|                 | Other matters   |
|                 | The PVR Bill has been reported back by the Select Committee<br>and is currently at 19 on the Provisional Order Paper for 7<br>December 2021. However, with only six more sitting days, the<br>Bill is unlikely to pass in 2021. MBIE hope that the Bill will pass<br>in February/March 2022, and are still aiming for it to come into<br>force in June 2022.  |

|  | The policy decisions for the PVR Regulations went through<br>Cabinet on 24 November 2021. The MBIE legal section are<br>preparing drafting instructions, MBIE hope to release an<br>exposure draft of the regulations in February/March 2022.   |

Stakeholder<br>Engagement<br>update | IPONZ would like to receive feedback on what<br>information/analytics would be helpful for their stakeholders.<br>As noted above, the 'Facts and figures' section on IPONZ's<br>website (under 'About us') includes information about IPONZ<br>filing volumes, which is updated monthly.  |
|  | Pendency information is updated quarterly.  |
|  | It was noted that more rapid communication would be helpful<br>in some circumstances, e.g. the recent situation where void<br>notices were erroneously issued on a number of cases because<br>of a change in status on the related hearings cases.  |
| 5. Draft Guidelines                    | Section 67 - Applicants must act by deadline if deadline set by Commissioner (update) (Simon M)   |
| review and<br>discussion               | IPONZ provided an updated draft of these guidelines, which<br>incorporated feedback from the last Patents TFG meeting. The<br>TFG provided further feedback.  |
|  | Regulation 38 – 44 Change Agents (Jenny J)  |
|  | The TFG provided feedback.  |
|  | Sections 129 and 165 Ownership changes (Jenny J)  |
|  | The TFG provided feedback.  |
| 6. Practice queries                    | Parent-divisional overlap in view of Oracle   |
| and discussion                         | It was noted that the IPONZ guidelines on parent/divisional<br>overlap required further amendment in view of Oracle. IPONZ<br>has deferred consideration of that decision in the hope that<br>the IP Laws Amendment Bill may resolve at least some of the<br>issues. However, the pace of progress of that Bill suggests that<br>strategy may need to be revisited. |
|  | Designs representations   |
|  | The IPONZ system only allows the filing of designs<br>representations in .jpg or .gif format. Representations cannot<br>be filed in .pdf format, unlike many other offices. IPONZ<br>explained this is because they follow WIPO standard ST88.  |

|   | Often , IPONZ cites prior art that has been cited by other<br>offices and/or during international phase. IPONZ are currently working on how they store<br>citation information in their database, but copyright issues are<br>also relevant. |
| 7. Any other business                   | Following the acquisition of Baldwins by AJP, there is a vacancy<br>on the Patents TFG. IPONZ suggested an in-house<br>representative would be appropriate.   |
